RESCUE BOAT DUTY

Would rescue boat crews please gen up on the instructions before taking the boat out.

Some crews are taking more interest in the view than the race and are even drifting away from it.

Preferably stay in the middle of the triangle or near the gybe mark. In heavy weather you should have a second person on board.

The rescue boat should stay on the water until all the boats are back on the beach, unless they have notified you that they want to stay out alone.

As regards safety, the senior officer of the Club present has the last word.

Please take safety seriously, we don't want any accidents.

Over 18 races an average of 10 boats per start with turnouts varying between 2 and 20 starters.

The EASTER CUP was won by A. & J. Smith in Taser 1298. Only 8 boats competed, and with winds in excess of force 5/6 and gusting only 2 boats completed the race.

TASER OPEN Sunday May 23rd

Porthpean's rapidly developing Taser Class 'chose' demanding conditions under which to stage its first Taser Open Meeting. With a fresh South Easterly producing a heavy swell at sea and a testing surf on the beach making launching and recovery difficult, race officers P. Jenkin decided to control operations from the shore using a Clubline Start.

The Club was pleased to welcome current Taser National Champion and ex-Porthpean Scorpion helm (circa 1977) Malcolm Lee and his crew, Keith Paul, together with the Class Racing Secretary Alan Labrum and his wife Gillian.

Five boats braved the conditions for the first race, however Stacey Bray and John Jenkin were soon forced to retire having broken the top section of their mast and were later followed by Dennis and Heather Bray.

The remaining boats coped superbly and the race- shortened to three rounds- was dominated by Lee who won comfortably with Labrum in second place; Adrian and Jerry Smith were a close third, only to find that they were over the line at the start.

After lunch conditions deteriorated and, in the interests of safety, racing was postponed until the following day.

Monday Morning produced almost ideal conditions - a gentle swell and a S.W. 3/4.

Race 2 was again dominated by Malcolm Lee, obviously drawing on his experience from his days at P.S.C., he picked his way up the first beat and established a good lead at the windward mark followed by Alan Labrum and Mike Trise (+ tactical advisor Sharon Quick). The positions over the finishing line were:

Race 3 produced the same finishing order but for a time it seemed that Ade Smith might surprise the visitors, sailing very ft off wind, he led at the windward mark by five seconds from Lee and Labrum but- to paraphrase his graphic description of what went wrong - he blew it on the second beat.

ENTERPRISE/MIRROR OPEN, Sunday 28th June 1987

With a thick blanket of fog still covering the Bay at 10.30a.m. the Race Officer Paul Jenkin announced a postponement until conditions improved. Fortunately within the hour the mist had lifted sufficiently to lay a course and just after 11.30 eighteen Enterprises and 7 Mirrors - quite the best combined fleets for some years - came under starter's orders.

In a shifting South Westerly most of the Enterprises opted for

the favoured starboard end of the line and in the ensuing logjam, much vocal criticism, (not all of it constructive), was in evidence and a good number of boats felt obliged to reround the bouy.

The Enterprises were led home by J. Williams from Penzance, while in the Mirrors, after a close race, Lionel and Neil Rigby were narrowly beaten by A. Williams from Restronguet.

The first afternoon races were won by R. Cain in Enterprise 19584 and Lionel Rigby in Mirror 65034.

A freshening breeze for the third race clearly suited P.S.C. helm Richard Armstrong and crew Andrew Penaluna and they were well in contention throughout, finally finishing in third place .
