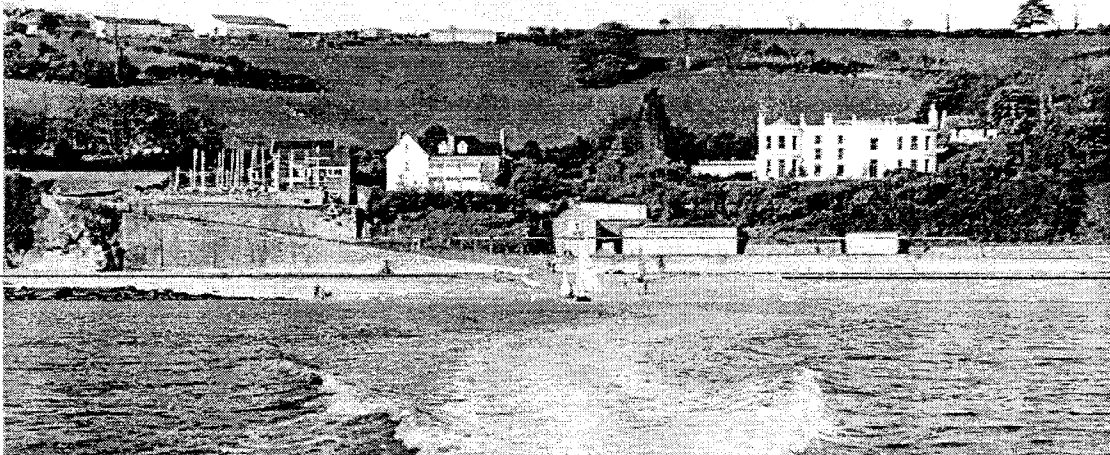

The Tasar Nationals went very smoothly, many thanks to all of you who helped there and those who took part. The overall profit was just under £4000 which is excellent. This and a donation of £1000 from Restormel Borough Council and perhaps a few more donations and offers of help have made it possible to tell the architect and builder to go ahead with the changing room and balcony extension. This project has been talked about for at least seven years so it is about time it got off the ground.

There are essential repairs needed to the corner of the building over the rescue boat shed, (garage?) so our final bill will be higher than the first estimates but we will have to find the money.

Some optimistic member is suggesting new plastic windows as next years project!?

The photographs are good, if you missed that Sunday then polish your boat, have a new hair style and try to get your picture taken next spring when Rob will come again.

We are going to work on odd jobs, marks, ground tackle, boats and engines, eventually decorating etc. on Sunday mornings, 9.30 a.m. to 12.30 p.m. so do save a few Sundays for these work parties if possible

## Treasurer's Report

As at 24th September 1998, the account balances were:

Profits from the Tasar Nationals including Bar and Galley takings totalled £3,768.45 thanks to the hard work and commitment of those club members who helped during the week. This amount will be added to the building fund (Savings A/c) to help towards the repairs and improvements being carried out to the club house.

Together with the contribution of £1,000 from Restormel BC and the many donations received from members, the club is on track to achieve the necessary funds for the building work to which we are now committed. However, additional work will be required after the main building project is completed in order to refurbish the club's facilities. So the option of Life Membership is still open to anyone willing to pay 10 years subscriptions at 1998 rates. Also, the subscriptions for 1999 are due in November, but the AGM is not until December 8th. - when the rates may well be increased - so pay early for next year while 1998 rates still apply!

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## *A Tale of Two Nationals*

Last August, 1997, Neil & I attended the Tasar Nationals at Babbacombe. There was an entry of 35. Upon arrival we found that there was no reserved boat parking spaces, we just had to berth the boats wherever we could find a space on the sea front. The weather was dismal to say the least. Babbacombe like Porthpean faces East and therefore suffers just like we do when Easterlies blow. Sure enough on the Sunday we had a force 3 easterly with drizzle. Some of the fleet ventured out for the practice race which was held close inshore. Sailing out wasn't too difficult but coming ashore was the usual heart in the mouth stuff. Will I broach or sail straight up the beach sort of thing that we have all experienced at Porthpean from time to time. We didn't bother going out because we knew what the return would be like. Monday dawned even worse with stronger winds and large waves crashing on the beach, add a few gallons of rain plus the wind and all racing was cancelled. Tuesday was just as bad and racing was cancelled again. One Tasar, a brand new one, did go out for a

sail, however he got into difficulties coming in, resulting in the bow of the boat being torn off, the mast bent like a banana and the crew being taken to hospital with a broken leg. The boat had nose dived when coming ashore on the front of a large wave. you could tell that people were beginning to get rather frustrated. On the Wednesday the wind had died off and though the sea was still lumpy we did manage to sail 2 races in very light conditions. Thursday, in even lighter conditions, we only managed one race. Friday proved to be a nice day, sunny with a nice force 2-3 and we were all set to get two races in when a thick sea mist descended on us. No racing until after lunch when the mist finally lifted and took the wind with it. We did manage to sail two races on the worst courses that I have ever had to sail, though we did win one of them. We were out no further than our beach marks and came in almost to the shore line. The competitors were not a very happy bunch, so you can imagine I wasn't feeling too optimistic when they asked me if Porthpean would host the 1998 Nationals, I wasn't feeling too confident of how successful it would be if we should suffer similar conditions as Babbacombe. Well you all saw the result of our Nationals and the rest as they say is history.

Thankyou all for helping to put on what was the best Tasar Nationals that I have ever been involved in. The Competitors were impressed with everything about our Club. The organisation worked well, the atmosphere was great, people were happy and we did have some sunny weather at the start and end of the week. The races were held in a most efficient way. Yes we did have rather strong winds at times, but that was compensated by some of the most breathtaking and thrilling reaches that most people had ever experienced. Fortunately the winds blew from the North West which allowed easy launching and recovery. I was told many times during the week, by various competitors, how much they were enjoying the Championship. So may I take this opportunity as not only a competitor but also as a Club member to thank all Porthpean Members who gave up their time and helped in even the smallest way to make a very happy and successful Championship.

I was a little perturbed as to how many people would want to help as we had asked a lot of Club members the previous year with the Scorpions. Now it would be wrong of me to mention names, when doing a thankyou, because with the best will in the world I would be bound to forget somebody and I do not wish to upset anyone. However I would like to mention the RAF who gave us superb rescue cover in what proved to be quite difficult conditions during mid week and allowed racing to proceed, that may otherwise have been cancelled if we were only relying on our own rescue boats. Paul Beacon and Peter Pope came through the ordeal of Race Officers with flying colours. The fact that they were able to operate from the superb Committee boat that was loaned to us by John and Wendy Hawkins helped them no end, and I am sure that they will be quite happy to tackle another Championship fleet in the future. Something tells me that the Tasar fleet want to come back again, so be prepared.



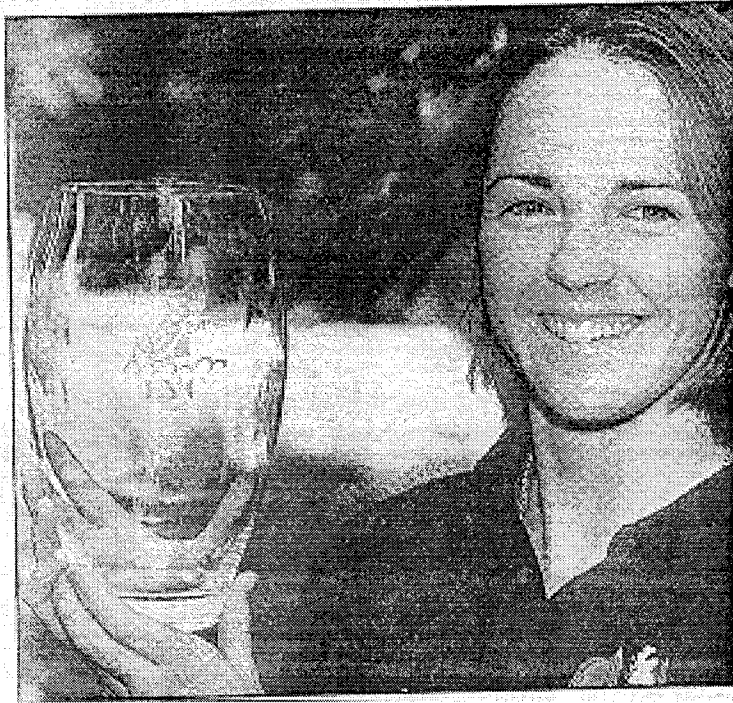
The following items have been identified as requiring attention but there may be others that you know of that you could draw to the committee's attention:-
