Completed (or in progress):

- Sharp Knife & Wire Cutters for RIB
- Working handheld radios; *The Club has 4 handhelds. 1 of those inoperable at last Nationals has now been replaced. The oldest (which worked continuously at the last Nationals) may be replaced after the Contender Nationals. The base set should not be used at 25w (which it defaults to) and this is being disabled. We have also traced a company who will hire handhelds if we need them for future events.*

- Can Crusher & recycling bins
- New internal rubbish bins
- Burgees for each RIB

- Sort out Bar sink so that you can get to it!
- Changing Room upgrade – heaters required, tiling, new flooring (men's showers?)

Items deferred:

- Re-cloth pool table
- Anemometer (hand-held if club based one not possible): *It was agreed that a club based anemometer was not feasible (as it could not be positioned where it would show an accurate reading). Tim Baily has volunteered that the RIB crew could use his own hand-held so that it could be decided how useful this was prior to the Club purchasing one.*
- Bar Dishwasher (although current one is useable, it isn't user-friendly): *The current bar manager is satisfied with current dishwasher so no replacement required*
- Decking: *This was deferred to later in the year due to cost and practicality considerations.*
- Tarmac boatyard: *It was suggested that this be undertaken in parts later in the year as a long-term project. Concrete would be used not tarmac.*
- Quad Bike for towing RIB etc up slip: *It was decided that the costs and legal implications of this suggestion made it unviable*
